Missing People Return Home Interview Form

Good Practice

- Links to siblings and family case records
- Personal details including name, age, gender, and home address
- Legal, child's and referral status
- Chronology contact stages (initial response)
- Risks including risk factors, risk type, and risk assessments
- RHI 'offered' section, generating an RHI form
- Option to link and provide RHI's and missing episodes
- Length of time missing
- Name of reporting person
- Missing episode and missing report date and time
- Resilience and protective factors
- 'What are we worried about?' section including documenting concerns about home, friends/associates, and risk indicators
- Missing episode Push/Pull factors, what happened during missing episode, prevention techniques, and views from other professionals.

Reminder

- The biggest thing is to not interrupt if they are telling their story. Also, be careful not to "lead" the person's story by trying to offer interpretations of what they are saying.
- Try to not write anything down as this may make the child/young person feel uncomfortable. If you do need to write anything down, then ask for permission.

	body language/demeanour, and a summary of their overall engagement during the RHI.
	- Include any important safeguarding concerns that were identified and how/who/when the information was shared.
Team Manager's Response/Decision	Open text -

Additional points:

- 1) If you try to engage with a child/young person/family/care staff but receive no response, it is best practice to provide the questions asked and any non-verbal responses in the RHI form.
- 2) Provide voice of the child/young person throughout the RHI form, including using verbatim (quotations) where possible.
- 3) We recommend providing the above 'Prompts' on a question sheet for staff to refer to prior to conducting an RHI.
